

# PRESENTATION

2018 has been the **European Year of Cultural Heritage**. This event has determined the evolution of the activities of the PRAT-CARP Cultural Route, which has participated in countless meetings and events presenting its network model of archaeological sites and giving visibility to its partners and their rock destinations.

Likewise, throughout 2018, projects have been developed with a strong vocation for transnational and transregional cooperation between regions of Europe that share, as a main link, the world's benchmarks in the field of Rock Art and Prehistoric Heritage, as it has been the case of the cooperation protocol developed between Dordogne-Cantabria-Castilla y León-Foz Côa.

In 2018, Ekainberri (10 years since its inauguration) and the Cave of Tito Bustillo (50th anniversary of its discovery) celebrated their anniversaries, in both places there have been numerous activities to celebrate its anniversaries. The PRAT-CARP family has congratulated and accompanied them throughout this important year.

With all these events, we can say that the exchange of experiences in the field of conservation and dissemination of rock art in Europe has been constant and a goal fulfilled.

The PRAT-CARP CR has continued working on the consolidation of a common strategy in favour of the conservation, valorization and cultural and tourist diffusion of the archaeological and rock heritage of Europe, looking for opportunities and new partners to incorporate into the largest European network of tourism archaeological, spreading the values of networking and seeking funding that facilitates the cohesion of its members and the possibility that they work together.

But it has not been a simple year, and although the PRAT-CARP network's dissemination activity has been frenetic, for another year it has not yet been possible to obtain a European projectendowed with funds-capable of promoting work in network of partners. An INTERREG ATLANTIC ESPACE project has just been rejected in the final phase of selection, another COSME project was not submitted on time (due to an unfortunate confusion of the head of the partnership), and only the projects presented to the EUROPE WITH CITIZENS programme are pending resolution.

Despite this, 2018 has also brought good news. We started the year celebrating a new edition of our TRAINING SEMINAR FOR STAFFS IN ATTENTION TO THE PUBLIC IN ROCK ART DESTINATIONS (Morella, Spain); In the month of March, our CR granted its first EUROPEAN ROCK ART HERITAGE certificate (to the Archaeological Area of Siega Verde, Castilla y León, Spain); In May, the Council of Europe renewed our mention as Cultural Route of the Council of Europe for another 3 years (until the end of 2021); in June, the UISPP rewarded our Itinerary for its work of disseminating Rock Art internationally; a total of 6 new institutions have joined the CR (with another 3 entities in process for January 2019); our partners have developed more than 500 activities and events of national and international impact ... we really move forward.

Congratulations to all for another year of joint work!

Several managers received him and showed its destinations and the management ways of these destinations.



#### **ROUNDTABLE 2:**

Cultural Routes of the Council of Europe and UNESCO World Heritage Sites: existing and potential future synergies

According to Resolution CM/Res (2013)67, Cultural Routes of the Council of Europe must « take account of and promote the charters, conventions, recommendations and work of the Council of Europe, UNESCO and ICOMOS relating to heritage restoration, protection and enhancement, landscape and spatial planning ». Cultural Routes of the Council of Europe often cross sites inscribed on the World Heritage List. A number of sites inscribed on the WHL are approaching the Cultural Routes of the Council of Europe are interested in inscribing their heritage, tangible or intangible, on the WHL. Roundtable 2 will offer the occasion to discuss the added value of certifications and labels from the Cultural Routes point of view, comparing the Council of Europe and UNESCO definitions of heritage, its values (European/universal) and its socio-economic role, and envisaging new synergies between the two programmes.
