INTRODUCTION: A CULTURAL ROUTE OF REFERENCE

After the COVID19 pandemic, the Council of Europe organised in the town of Chania (Crete, Greece) its ANNUAL CONSULTATIVE FORUM OF CULTURAL ITINERARIES, from 4 to 7 October 2022. The great family of the Cultural Heritage of Europe met again and once again our Cultural Route participated actively in it, represented by our secretary, Leoncio Carrascal, and the technical coordinator, Ramón Montes (who participated in the General Session 3, entitled FOSTERING CREATIVE INDUSTRIES, CULTURAL TOURISM, INNOVATIVE TECHNOLOGIES FOR SUSTAINABLE COMMUNITIES).

During the Forum, several working meetings were held with representatives of other Cultural Routes and contacts and meetings with some ambassadors of the signatory countries of the Enlarged Partial Agreement of the Cultural Routes (Norway, Turkey, Azerbaijan and Spain) were developed.

We also introduced the TRAINING ACADEMY 2023 of the Cultural Routes which will be organised by our European Cultural Route, the Institute of Cultural Routes of Luxembourg and the CONSÉIL DÉPARTEMENTAL DE LA DORDOGNE and which will take place in Périguéux-Montignac/Lascaux from 30 May to 2 June next year. This seminar is the most important event of the year for the 48 European Cultural Routes, as it brings together technicians and managers of the 48 European Cultural Routes to improve their training and address governance issues and joint projects.

In addition, the PRAT-CARP Cultural Route introduced in the session 3 a group of good practices that we are developing in the last years, such as the RUPESTRIAN PASSPORT (promoted by the Protocol https://eupal.prehistour.eu/), the ART-POINTS project (currently in the application phase for the INTERREG programme and EXPERIENCIAS ESPAÑA - Next Generation Funds), the exchanges of expert information between PRAT-CARP members on new technologies applied to preservation and dissemination of Rock Art sites.

On behalf of the Enlarged Partial Agreement on Cultural Routes of the Council of Europe (EPA), it is my pleasure to inform you that at its 5-6 May 2022 meeting, the EPA Governing Board decided to renew the "Cultural Routes of the Council of Europe" certification to the "Prehistoric Rock Art Trails" for a term of three-years, in accordance with the criteria for certification contained in Committee of Ministers Resolution CM/Res (2013)67. The decision was confirmed by written procedure on 31st May 2022.

I should like to congratulate you and all the members of the "Prehistoric Rock Art Trails" as Cultural Route of the Council of Europe for your continued cooperation with the Enlarged Partial Agreement on Cultural Routes of the Council of Europe. I should like to thank your staff for your presence at the EPA Governing Board meeting in Luxembourg and for your presentation to the member States, who appreciated the opportunity of the exchange of views.

On the occasion of the 2021-2022 Certification Cycle, the Secretariat put forward a list of recommendations to be addressed by the network in the framework of its next regular evaluation based on the independent evaluation report attached to this letter (Annex 1). Please note that the next regular evaluation of your route will be carried out in the framework of the 2025-2026 Certification Cycle.

I should like to use this opportunity to remind you about the benefits of being a certified Cultural Route of the Council of Europe as well as of the required <u>visibility guidelines</u> and your continued <u>engagement</u> in the Cultural Routes of the Council of Europe Programme. Further details can be found in the attached documents (Annex 2 and Annex 3).

Please note that according to the above-mentioned visibility guidelines, certified Cultural Routes of the Council of Europe are required to display the certification logo next to their own logos in all printed documents, websites, social media accounts, promotional materials and any other communication support produced by the network.

I look forward to seeing you at the 2022 Annual Advisory Forum on 5-7 October 2022 in Chania, Crete (Greece).

The seminar: ROCK ART ON THE WATER (Laukaa-Mikkeli 6-9 June 2022)

The first two days were devoted to the fieldwork: technical visits to the sites of Saraakallio and Astuvansalmi so that experts from several countries could see the current situation of the Finnish rock art sites, their archaeological character and the issues for their conservation and public access. They were also able to appreciate the model of tourist visit based on viewing the panels from boats.

In the case of Saraakallio, the paintings are not accessible and visitors can only observe them from a boat at a distance that does not allow a clear view. At Astuvansalmi tourists can disembark and see the paintings from a precarious wooden gangway that at least enables many of the numerous paintings to be viewed. A modest information panel provides some explanations about them.

The sessions on 9 June took place in the auditorium of the War and Peace Centre in the town of Mikkeli. Different models for the management and tourist uses of rock art in Europe were presented, especially the experiences of Vale de Côa (Douro region, Portugal) and the Vèzére Valley (Dordogne, France), where water plays a major role in the visits to the rock art sites.

The latest models for the exhibition of the phenomenon of prehistoric art in different countries were also presented: from Norway to Azerbaijan, including such regions as Valcamónica (Italy) and Cantabria, Extremadura and the east of the Iberian Peninsula (Spain).

In the second part of the seminar, the rock art of Finland was approached from different points of view. These included not only archaeological and ethnographic aspects but also a presentation about the culture and world of the shamans in the Sámi nation.




